John-Lewis Brown acquired this estate in the early 19th century and decided to build a Tudor-style chateau there, reminiscent of his Scottish origins. This building, one of the most unusual in the Médoc, is surrounded by a remarkable English-style grounds.

John-Lewis Brown, a famous animal painter and lover of fine wine, organised sumptuous receptions at Château Cantenac-Brown until 1843, when the estate was sold to a banker, Mr. Gromard.

The quality of the wine was acknowledged in the 1855 classification, when Château Cantenac-Brown was included among the third growths.

One hundred fifty years later, the Simon Halabi family has given a new impetus to this estate with a British atmosphere, which they are determined to raise to the very highest level. José Sanfins presently manages Cantenac Brown. He does his utmost to make the most of the magnificent terroir, lavishing the greatest of care on the soil and the vines, with great respect for the environment. This meticulous attention to detail continues into the cellar, where everything possible is done to produce an exceptional wine.
